Facilities for Students

### STUDENT FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

The University established Student Financial Aid Office (SFAO) on October 28, 2007 in collaboration with Higher Education Commission (HEC), Islamabad to provide financial help to the needy and deserving students of the University, The aim of SFAO is to provide information & resources a timely and equitable manner. It also provides several personalized online services to the students.

PROCEDURE FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The applications for the concession in fee have to be submitted on the prescribed forms after the admission in the University and these forms are available from the Fnancial Aid Office. The signature of father/guardian on the form is essential.

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

Merit scholarships by the Government include Kayla Gift Fund Trust, Quaid-e-Azam, Mora, Hafiz-e-Quran, District Council, Chief Minister, Pakistan Bait-ul-Maal and University Position Holders. The deserving Muslim students can get stipends from Provincial Zakat Fund. Deserving students should get an eligibility proof from the elected representative of the area and submit the application to the Zakat and Usher Committee Officer after getting it attested by the Deputy Registrar (FAO).

### **ACCOMMODATION**



The University presently maintains two hostel for boys and four for girls. Due to inadequate resource six hostels are established in private buildings rented outside the University premises. For effective functioning and establishment of new hostels an administrative body has been setup called Hall Council. In all the hostels the residents are provided with the necessary facilities including internet. The mess is run by the students. Provision of hostel accommodation is based on merit. The students desirous of availing this facility submit their applications to the office of the warden of the hostels through the chairperson / Incharge of their respective department.

### DIGITAL LIBRARY

To facilitate research in the University, HEC has provided access to digital libraries. A programme has been formulated to provide researchers and students with access to latest, authentic literature form high quality journals, database and articles covering a wide range of disciplines. Digital library resources provided by HEC are: Sprigerlink, Blackwell, Synergy, Ebrary, Ebscohost, McGrwa Hill's Collections McGrew-Hill's Access Science, McGraw Hill's Digital Engineering Library, Taylor & Francis Journals, Oxford University Press, E-Books and free medical journals. On the other hand GC University is the only institution which has its own digital book bank which has been developed through the sole effort of University's IT Services Department. It contains over 25000 e-books for different

fields of interest, downloadable software and virtual lectures videos. Domain of this book bank is expanding day by day to cater to the needs of academicians and students.

### **LIBRARIES**

The importance of dissemination of knowledge and keeping up-to-date with the rest of the world is the need of the present day. Libraries play a vital role in attaining the educational goals and fulfilling the instructional needs of the programmes offered by universities. As they serve as a source of professional reference services and information to supplement classroom and laboratory learning, libraries also contribute to the teaching / learning environments of the academic departments. The old Armstrong library has been renamed as the Main Library with the book bank accessible to all the students and faculty members. The Main Library has more than 16,000 text and reference books. In addition, there are post graduate libraries at various academic blocks and recently a library in Basic Science Block is established to fulfill the needs of the students. The collection of each library includes not only the reference books supporting each course in the curriculum



but also general books, periodipublicacals, tions, newspapers and digital resources. The Com-Library mittee is responsible for efficient the working of the libraries. dvnamic team of devoted and highly qualified

professional librarians run the library affairs.

### IT INFRASTRUCTURE

It has become a dire need of the University to create an environment in which the faculty and students can communicate and collaborate with each other by using modern state of the art technologies. The local area network of the University comprises high speed fiber optic cables which are connected to the core switch inside the Server room. These cables then reach all the departments from where fast Ethernet cables are connected for the linkage of all the computers. IT Services are working tirelessly with highly qualified and skilled staff to maintain and manage the IT infrastructure under the directions of IT manager

WIRELESS AND WIRED INTERNET FACILITY

GC University is amongst the very few universities which have given the facility of wireless internet to both the students and the staff members. The University has the credit of being the first university which is using this hi-end intelligent Wi-Fi system. The wireless setup comprises modern state of the art technology which is both robust and resilient. The IT Services Department provides 24/7 internet access.

High end servers are used as the backbone of IT framework. Xeon Servers with an excellent entry level multi-processing which can take dual Xeon EM 64bit processors and maximum of 8 GB RAM RAM memory. These servers have hot swappable hard drivers. Facilities like internet, Domain Name Server, routing, user authentication, SMTP and POP3 email services, workgroup application, file and print share are provided. The University website is also looked after and updated regularly by the IT Services Department. Efforts are being made to make the website more attractive and interactive for its users. GC University provides its faculty, staff and students with personal university email addresses.

### VIDEO CONFERENCE FACILITY

GC University Faisalabad has its own Video Conferncing Unit provided by the Higher Education Commission. GCUF conducted its scholarship interviews through video conferencing via HEC. This unit provides the facility to take online lectures, seminars, conferences, thesis defence from both national and international universities.

## Directorates

### **DIRECTORATE OF ADVANCED STUDIES**

This Directorate is the vision of Professor Dr. Shahid Mahboob Rana to maintain academic discipline, standardization and parity with global norms. Its aim to streamline the functionality of academics through curricula revision and application of academic standards in the diverse academic scenario in the University. The major areas of its activities are:

Uniformity and quality assurance in formatting of research documents.

Preliminary thrashing of thesis, projects and research reports in terms of format, citation and presentation.

Assurance of the application of University academic rules in all the departments.

Observation of minimum qualification for the award of degree.

Timely processing of thesis evaluation.

Streamlining the working of studies at all academic disciplines and departments.

Recommending new rules and procedures to ensure the academic discipline in the light of different directives and precedents.

Within one year the standardization of synopses of thesies and other research presentations have successfully been made in line with the international patterns besides developing a distinctive GC look and raising the directorate from one research officer to a full flagged directorate headed by a director. Faculty members and scholars have been trained through lectures and discussions to follow GC format in future presentations.

### **DIRECTORATE OF STUDENTS' AFFAIRS**

Directorate of Students' Affairs (DSA), Govt. College University, Faisalabad, not only focuses on the overall personality grooming of students but also covers discipline, health facilities, workshops, career services, counseling services, and financial assistance to students in the back-drop of emerging modern trends in the education sector. This office was assigned the task of working for the promotion and facilitation of co-curricular and cultural activities. In a short span of two years DSA has been successfully providing a forum with ten functional societies to the students to express their recreational and literary talents. Life on campus for students, teaching and non-teaching staff is marked with multi-dimensional cultural functions and academic activity.

Various seminars on current national and international issues have also been organized. Musical evenings, Shame-Ghazal, theatrical performances by the students, debate competitions, fun fair and regular sports activities in the University keep the students involved in creative activities, polish their organizational skills thus keeping them away from getting themselves involved in any anti-social or extremist activities.

In the shape of University magazine *The Beacon*, the students find the best way to present their creative maturity in prose and poetry. Inter-university tours provide students with opportunities to get the latest information, update their knowledge with a sense of positive comparison and develop in them a sense of belonging.

### DIRECTORATE OF RESEARCH

is committed to facilitate research and knowledge creation through human resource management and our resolve is the uplift of this nation and enhancement of the quality of life.

The establishment was revitalized during 2009 by redefining the T.O.Rs by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. Shahid Mahboob Rana. The directorate is currently coordinating with the funding agencies, university researchers and HEC awardees for various scholarships. The directorate is the university liaison office for different funding agencies and industries.

More than 50 research proposals have been sent for funding to various national and global funding agencies during the year 2009. Out of these, three have been awarded, ten qualified after peer review and are being revised for funding and the rest are under the process of peer reviewing. With the execution of a good number of research projects at the campus, the University will emerge as an authentic name of knowledge generation and a symbol of quality in R&D.

During 2009, this directorate mediated for holding a six day HEC-funded workshop on Research Methodology, 3 Seminars in coordination with Gen-Prom; a UNDP-Funded project on gender-promotion, two lectures by visiting scholars of foreign universities and two workshops on "Project Development and Execution". Recently, National Youth Conference on the theme "Islam, Democracy and Terrorism" was organized with the collaboration of "BARGAD", an NGO working for youth enlightenment. About 300 participants including students and faculty members from 24 universities attended the event. Apart from organizing research based participatory activities, this Directorate has started working on compiling University data.

Publications of University Progress Report and information reflecting at web sources of Pakistan Council of Science and Technology are but some of the contributions of this establishment.

This directorate is also mediating linkages of University with other institutions related with education, research and industry. GC University, Faisalabad is one of the institutions that promotes research productivity and gives incentive to its published research work. Determination and evaluation of productivity allowance is another achievement of this directorate.

Under the guidelines of HEC, the Syndicate has recently approved a bigger infra-structural set-up of this establishment. This voluminous increase in infra-structure and mandate will facilitate the development of on-campus research culture. The directorate is likely to expand in the management of research operation, coordination and development that will give leverage to quality of higher education in the country and GC University, Faisalabad will become felt as site of quality research and education at national and international level.

Transformation of information into knowledge-based technologies is a sacred trust that has been entrusted to us by the current generation for making future human kind safe, secure and prosperous.







The Department aims to provide quality education in the areas of research. A number of HEC funded projects are also underway and academia is focusing to broaden need-based research endeavors. Microbial and Plant Biotechnology, Plant Physiology, Plant Tissue Culture, Molecular Biology and Fungal Systematics are the focal areas of research within the department.

Currently, research is being carried out in the field of fungal taxonomy especially in Coelomycetes and Hyphomycetes, biocontrol of plant diseases by fungi, fungal diseases of fish and fungal human disease. Mechanism of stress tolerance in plants is being studied. Study of Genetic basis of salt tolerance is also under progress in different crops. Furthermore Genomic resources ae being utilized to enhance crop production by gene manipulation. Unraveling of various physiological and biochemical mechanism of stress tolerance in plants is in progress. Moreover, research on seed metabolism, plant nutrition, enzymology and plant growth regulators is in progress in different economically important crops.

Postgraduate study is also underway in the field of Enzymology, Mycology, Plant Physiology, Medicinal plants & Plant tissue culture. Besides being actively involved in transferring knowledge to the students, the highly qualified faculty is also upgrading its educational skills through local and overseas training programmes. Four members have rejoined the Department after completion of their Post-Doctoral studies during 2008.

The Department of Botany is becoming the first choice of students of learning through out Pakistan and the number of students is increasing annually. At present, 96 students are enrolled in BS(Hons), 65 in M.Sc., 30 in M.Phil. and 9 in Ph.D. programme.

The importance of law as a profession especially in Pakistan can never be underestimated. In order to meet the demands and challenges of rapidly growing global world, attempts are being made to improve the standards of legal education in Pakistan. Therefore, there is strong need to improve the standard of education and training in legal profession. Higher Education Commission in collaboration with Pakistan Bar Council has sought to remedy the situation and much progress has recently been made.

Before 1993 LL.B was a two year programme comprising F.E.L. and LL.B. During this time teaching was mostly at a surface level and subjects like Pakistan Penal Code and Criminal Procedure Code with over 500 sections between them were compressed into a single hundred marks subject As a result most of the international universities did not recognize our degree. Three years law programme was initiated in 1993. In 2005 a National Curriculum Committee was constituted under the Auspices of Higher Education Commission.

Representative of Pakistan Bar Council as well as Educationists and certain governmental personnel were part of this committee. A major decision taken by the committee was that law should no longer be taught in Urdu anywhere in the country. A second decision was that law should be a five year programme rather than a three year programme. A detailed curriculum was then discussed and proposed for the five year programme. A

pilot project was recently started in University of Punjab and also in Lahore University of Management Sciences. GC University Faisalabad has therefore become the third university in the Country to propose and initiate such a programme from fall 2008. The curriculum proposed before the Board of Studies has primarily been designed under the guidelines given by the National Curriculum Committee

# Abridged Examination Rules

#### Schedule of Semesters:

There should be two semesters and one summer session/break in academic year.

- 1. Fall semester will normally commerce from 1st week of October.
- 2. Spring semester will normally commence from 4<sup>th</sup> week of February.
- 3. Summer session/break of 6-8 weeks commencing from 1st week of August.

#### **Graduate / Post Graduate Programmes:**

General admission criterion is as follows.

- 1. Admission to various academic programmes will be made according to the schedule advertised by the university in the leading national newspapers and on the university website.
- 2. Admission is granted strictly on merit in according with the criteria laid down by the university.
- 3. Admission will be open to both male and female candidates.
- 4. Merit will be determined by the concerned department as prescribed by the university.
- 5. Admission on reserved seats will be made as per schedule notified by the university.
- 6. Admission to MS/M.Phil and PhD will be made as per HEC policy.
- 7. Age limits for Becholer and Master degree programmes are 24 and 26 years respectively. However age may be relaxed in special cases up to maximum 2 years by the competent authority.

#### **Bachelor Degree Programmes-B.S:**

- The minimum requirement for admission to this Programme is F.A / F.Sc or equivalent (to be determine by the equivalence committee.
- The normal period of study covers 8 semesters spread over four years.
- The minimum credit hours required for completion of programmes are 130/ as prescribed.

#### Master Degree Programme – M.A / M.Sc / M.com

- The minimum requirement for admission to these programmes is B.A/B.sc (two years programmes; i.e. 14 years of education) or equivalent.
- The normal period of study covers 4 semesters.
- The minimum credit hours required to complete are 66.
- Students are required to complete the prescribed number of credit either by course work or by course work and a thesis of 6/8 credits (equivalent to two optional courses of 3/4 credit each).
- Students not opting for thesis will select two optional papers offered by the department to complete their credits.
- Students having complete all the required course work with a minimum of grade C++ will be permitted to write thesis.
- Thesis will be evaluate by the examiner and defended by the candidate according to the prescribed examination procedure.

#### MS / M.Phil Degree Programmes.

The minimum requirement for the admission to these programmes is as under.

- M.A /M.Sc or B.S or equivalent. That is the 16 years of education.
- Candidate must have earned the C+ grade or maximum 50 marks in graduate study to get admission to MS/M.Phil programmes. However 45% marks are required for admission to MS/M.Phil English Linguistics.
- Candidate must have passed GAT/GRE as prescribed by the University.
- The normal period of study covers 4 semesters spread over two years.
- The students are required to take up compulsory and optional courses during the first two semesters, while the remaining two semesters are meant for research work, thesis writing and examination.
- Research work /thesis will be considered equivalent to 12 credit hours.

#### **Ph.D Degree Programmes:**

- Ph.D Programmes are research based program, in which students will study courses of 18 credits hours in 1st and 2nd semester. He / she will have to pass comprehensive exam and completes formalities before the enrollment.
- Candidates must have passed GRE international after two years M.Phil programmes to register for Ph.D.
- Normal period of study is three to five years. Extension may be granted by the competent authorities in special cases.
- Candidates must have earned at least 3.00 CGPA equivalent in MS/M.Phil to get enrolled for PH.D degree.

#### PROFESSIONAL DEGREE PROGRAMMES:

#### LLB

- The minimum requirement for admission to these programmes is B.A. / B.Sc. (old two years programmes) / 14 years of education or equivalent.
- The normal period of studies covers 6 semesters.
- The minimum credit hours required to complete are 99.

### Master in Business Administration (MBA 3 ½ Years Programme) Bachelor of Telecommunication Engineering (BTE)

Some general regulations are applicable unless specified. For Telecom Engineering a student must have passed entry test conducted by UET.

#### Pharm D

The minimum requirement for admission to this programme is F.Sc. Pre- Medical or equivalent.

The normal period of studies covers 10 semesters (05 years).

#### **General Rules**

Admission to various academic programme will be made according to the schedule advertised by the University in the leading national news papers and on website.

- Admission is granted strictly on merit in according with the criteria set by the university.
- Admission will be open to both male and female candidate.
- Merit will be determined by the concerned department as prescribed by the university.
- Admission to MS/ M.Phil and Ph.D Programmes will be made as per HEC policy / criteria.
- Age limits for Becholer and Master degree programmes are 24 and 26 years respectively. However age may be relaxed in special cases up to maximum 2 years by the competent authority.

#### ADMISSION / REGISTRATION RULES

The office of the Registrar is the central administrative office responsible for enrollment of students, maintaining the permanent record till the completion of the degree of the students and thereafter. Registration fee along with other dues will be received through Bank and office of the Registrar will be responsible for supervising the registration of the students. Every student will get a registration number which will be valid for the whole period of his / her studies.

#### Admission to a Department

The department in which the student plans to study shall determine whether or not the student meets the qualifications for admission to particular programmes. Each department shall have departmental Admission Committee comprising senior faculty members who shall scrutinize the credentials of applications as per laid down criteria on merit.

#### **Admission / Registration Process**

Applicants satisfying the entrance requirements as well as any additional requirements as determined by the concerned academic department shall apply on the prescribed form for registration. These students are normally admitted as first semester students.

Students are not permitted to register simultaneously in another programme of the University or any other University / Institution. In case of breach of this regulation, he / she will be require to leave the University.

#### **First Semester**

The process shall consist of the following steps:

- a. Submission of original documents to the office of the Chairperson of the department concerned.
- b. Admission Committee / faculty advisor for the security and verification.
- c. Allotment of Roll Number by the Chairperson and depositing of fee and other dues.
- d. Deposit of fees and dues by the candidate on prescribed fee voucher / Bank Challan Form in University Account.
- e. Submission of bank receipt to the Departmental Chairperson / Director of the Faculty/ Principal of College.
- f. Duly completed course registration form and submission of Registration Card / Form to the Chairperson / Director for approval.

#### Other Semester / Returning Students

- Enrollment in course in each semester is compulsory. It will be completed within a week from the commencement of a semester / announcement of the results.
- b. The authority may grant relaxation for another week in special cases.

#### Re-registration

Students separated from a programme on academic or disciplinary grounds may apply to Vice Chancellor for re-registration who has the discreation to accept or reject applications and also decide whether or not to give any credit to the students for courses already taken at the University. Student suspended from the programme on the medical ground can rejoin the programme after being examined and cleared by a University designated medical doctor. In such cases, students can be re-enrolled at the most once.

#### **Rejection of Application / Termination of Study**

GCUF reserves the right to reject an application or terminate study of a student at any time if any information given in his / her application form is found later to be untrue, false or incorrect.

#### Change of Course, Course Retake and Course Waiver

- A student may change an optional course / specialization with the written permission of the chairperson within 7 days after the commencement of the semester.
- b. A student may be allowed to repeat / retake a course which he / She could not complete under circumstance that were beyond his/her control and were duly recognized by the university
- c. Repetition / retake of a compulsory course is allowed twice only.
- d. A student may apply for course waiver. Application for course exemption must be submitted to the concerned academic department for approval. The application must be accompanied by the supporting documents showing that equivalent courses have been taken else where.
- e. In case of approval of his / her application the average of the remaining courses will be used to calculate grade point average.
- f. A student who earns a D or F grade in a course in any semester shell have to enroll the same course whenever offer by the department in regular semester are a designed remedial session whichever is feasible with the permission of the chairperson of the department. The student may not be allowed this provision for more than two courses (6 or 8 credit hours). A course can only be repeated once.

#### **CLASS ATTENDANCE**

- a) A candidate with less than 75% of the attendance in lectures and practical work or equivalent academic activity separately shall not be eligible to sit for the examination and may be dropped from the course.
- b) If a student fails to attend any lecture (without any authorization) during the first four weeks of the commencement of the semester as per the announced schedule, his / her admission shall stand cancelled automatically without any notice.
- c) A student may apply for the leave of absence in case of illness, family circumstances and in emergency. The length of leave will have to be mentioned and the circumstances should be explained in the application. The length of leave of absence will be a deciding factor whether he/ she can continue his / her studies for the rest of the semester. If the leave is longer than a specified period, the student may apply for the deferment of the semester.

#### **GPA / CGPA REQUIREMENT**

- a) Pass marks for Honors & Graduate programmes in a course are 40 percent both in theory and practical separately where practical is a part of a course. However, D grade will have to be improved for the completion of degree.
- b) Students dropped in one course in a semester will be enrolled in the next semester / remedial session, whenever offered and will complete all the course requirements.
- c) Minimum CGPA requirement for the award of Honors & Master degree is 2.00 for M.Phil 2.30 and for PhD 3.00.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR AWARD OF DEGREES

Candidate will be awarded the relevant degree, provided they have

- a) Undertaken a programme of study for a period not less than the normal period of study given for that programme;
- b) Completed the total credit hours of courses as stated in the regulations for that degree;
- c) Passed the prescribed examinations;
- (d) Qualified the comprehensive examination (if applicable).
- (e) Fulfilled minimum course work and laboratory work requirements, and
- (f) In case of thesis passed the viva voce and / or any other mode of assessment prescribed by the university.

#### **EVALUTION SYSTEM**

- The faculty is responsible for the evaluation of the students, their course and for the award of grades to them on the basis of such evaluation / assessment.
- The number and nature of examinations and assignments depends on the nature of the course. However, there will be at least two examinations during a semester Midterm Examinations and a Final Examination at the end of the semester in each course with the weightage as under

(a) Assignment = 15 %(b) Presentations, Quizzes / Viva Voce etc. = 10 %(c) Midterm Examination = 25 %(d) Final Examination (at the end of the semester) = 50 %

- The Final Examination will cover the entire course.
- There will be no choice in questions in the Midterm and Final examinations. As regards the contents of question paper (number of questions, type of questions and maximum mark etc.), the course instructor s supposed to set the same as he / she deems fit in conformity with the table of specification. It is , however, recommended that for a 4 credit hour course the question paper should not carry less than 40 marks in mid term examination and 80 marks (maximum) in the Final examination.
- After marking the script, the examiner will display the result of his / her course on the departmental notice board. The scripts of Midterm and Final examination shall be shown to the students by the course instructor.
- As a general rule, there will be no rechecking / reevaluation of the answer sheets / scripts after the results have been communicated to the Office of the Controller of Examinations.
- In case a student is not satisfied with his / her award, or clarification from the faculty, he / she may submit an application within a week of the notification of results to Chairperson / Director who will refer the case to the Examination Committee of the Department / Institute / College.
- The schedule of the Midterm and Final Examination shall be displayed by the academic department at least a week before the starting date. The schedule should include Comprehensive Examination, if applicable.

#### (A) RULES FOR PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER

#### B.A/B.S. (4 years), LLB(Hons) (5-Years), Pharm D (5 years) and M.A/M.Sc (2 years), LLB (3 years) programs:

- (i) At the end of the first Semester a student must obtain a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.70 and must have passed all the courses to be promoted to the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
  - (ii) A student who fails in one or two courses but achieves a GPA of 1.00 will be promoted to the next semester on probation. (iii) A student who fails to achieve GPA of 1.00 but failing in maximum of two courses will cease to be the student of the University.
  - Students must maintain a minimum CGPA of 1.70 at the end of the  $2^{nd}$  and higher semester otherwise they may not get the CGPA of 2.00 at the end of the programme, which is the requirement for the award of degree. Students who fails to achieve CGPA 1.70 in two semesters will cease to be the student of the University.

 $\rightarrow$ 

- If the CGPA of the student is below 2.00 but he / she has passed all the courses, he / she may be allowed to repeat the two courses in which he / she acquired grad-D to improve the final CGPA. However, the student must repeat these courses within the stipulated period of the concerned programme.
- The maximum duration of an Honors degree is 6 years and of Pharm-D 7 years and LLB(Hons) 5 years respectively. In case of M.A / M.Sc. degree the maximum duration will be 3 years and for LLB degree 4 years respectively.
- Those who fail in any course will enroll the same whenever it will be offered by the department / University in the coming semester / Summer Session.
- → In Summer Session maximum work load of 9-credit hours (3-courses) can be opted. Summer Session is normally for the final semester / outgoing students of Honor and Master Degree programmes.

#### (B) MS / M.Phil (2-years) and PhD Programmes

- At the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> semester a student must obtain a minimum Grade Point Average GPA of 2.00 to be promoted to 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
- In case a student is able to obtain GPA of 1.70 or more but less than 2.00 he / she will be promoted to the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester on probation. The candidate who fails to secure 1.70 GPA in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester shall stand automatically dropped from the rolls.
- At the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, a student must obtain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 in order to be promoted to the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.
- A student will be required a minimum CGPA 2.30 for the award of MS / M.Phil and 3.00 for Ph.D degree.
- → The stipulated period for the MS / M.Phil programmes is 3 years whereas for Ph.D programmes upto 5 years

#### MAKE UP EXAMINATION AND INCOMPLETE GRADE

i) Absence from any scheduled examination is permissible only in extreme situations beyond the control of the student, as authorized by the University. Serious illness of the student or death in the immediate family is regarded as a legitimate reason for scheduling a Make-up Examination.

Even in an emergency situation, the student or someone on his/her behalf must inform the Chairperson of the Department in writing before the examination is held.

ii) Request for scheduling a Make-up Examination must be made by the student on the Make-up Examination Petition Form which must be submitted to the Chairperson along with other required documents, within one week of missing the examination. The Chairperson will send such cases to Controller of Examinations for notification after the approval of the Competent Authority.

iii) The Make-up Examination of the Mid Semester Examination will be taken with the Final Examination of the same semester in the same sitting whereas the Make-up Examination of the Final Semester Examination may be held during the next Summer Session or with the next Mid-term Examination. Such a candidate shall be given Incomplete Grade ('I' Grade). Private arrangements for Make-up examination between a student and the teacher are not allowed.

#### FREEZING/DEFERMENT OF A SEMESTER

- i) A student may request for freezing of any semester accept the 1st semester.
- ii) For the freezing of a semester, the student will have to submit the request to the Authority through the Chairperson within two weeks of the start of the semester.
- iii) The freezing of semester is allowed in one semester. The student will have to pay dues at the prevalent of rejoining time and shall be required to follow the curriculum prescribed for new session as applicable.
- iv) The freezing period (time of absence) will not be included in the stipulated period for this programme.

#### **RE-SIT EXAMINATION**

A re-sit examination can be given to a student who fails in a:

- i) Required course or has missed the chance due to unavoidable circumstances.\*
- ii) He/she, however, should have attended the whole course and met the required attendance level.
- iii) Students who may have been debarred from taking an examination due to the shortage of attendance must get themselves enrolled for that course, whenever offered.
- iv) A student may be given a re-sit examination for a failed course once only.
- v) (\* This category of the students will be taking the exam as their 1st attempt.

There is no sports and co- curricular quota for Pharm-D, BTE, BBA, BBA (B&F) MBA, MBA (B&F) MBA (IM) MPA & BS (SE) programmes.

## Code of Conduct

#### **INTRODUCTION**

- 1. The GC University Faisalabad (GCUF) has since emerged as a leading research intensive university in Pakistan comparable to the top universities of the world. The university is fulfilling its responsibility of graduating culturally enlightened, technologically knowledgeable, academically competent, and research oriented productive citizens who are prepared to lead, inspire, and serve humanity. The university wholeheartedly commits itself and all its resources to this sacred trust and responsibility.
- 2. The GCUF community comprises a diverse population of students in pursuit of academic excellence. It strives to refine the ability of students to reason and to communicate freely and clearly so as to become responsible, morally equipped, moderate and well rounded citizens of a diverse world. It is therefore expected that these attributes, in turn, should be reflected in their everyday behaviour, attitude and dress.
- 3. GCUF believes that the regulations, guidelines, and safeguards described herein are indispensable features to maintaining an academic environment commensurate with the teaching, learning, and developmental endeavors of the university community.

#### **DEFINITION OF TERMS**

- 4. Definitions of different terms are:
  - a. Complainant means a person who makes a complaint or reports a violation of the University Code of Conduct or University regulations and policies.
  - b. Intentional means deliberate.
  - c. Respondent means a person who has been accused of violating the University Code of Conduct.
  - d. Student means any currently enrolled person for whom the institution maintains educational records, as defined by the University regulations.
  - e. Reckless means careless or heedless of the potentially harmful consequences of one's behavior, where risk of harm to persons, property or normal University operations exists or can be reasonably foreseen.
  - f. University Official is a person employed by the University in an administrative, supervisory, academic, research, or support staff position.
- Academic dishonesty. Academic dishonesty is an act of fraud, which may include misrepresentation, deceit, falsification, or trickery of any kind that is done by the student with the purpose, intent, or expectation of influencing a grade or other academic evaluation. Academic dishonesty also includes forgery and falsification of University academic documents, intentionally impeding or damaging the academic work of others, or assisting other students in acts of dishonesty. Common examples of academically dishonest behavior include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - a. **Cheating**. Intentionally using or attempting to use unauthorized materials, information, or study aids in any academic exercise; copying from another student's examination; submitting work prepared in advance for an in-class examination; taking an examination for another person or conspiring to do so.
  - b. **Fabrication**. Intentional and unauthorized falsification or invention of any information or citation in an academic exercise.
  - c. **Facilitating academic dishonesty**. Intentionally or knowingly helping or attempting to help another to commit an act of academic dishonesty.
  - d. **Plagiarism**. Intentionally or knowingly representing the words or ideas of another as one's own in any academic exercise; failure to attribute direct quotation, paraphrase, or borrowed facts or information.
  - e. **Unauthorized Collaboration**. Providing, either knowingly or through negligence, one's own work to assist a student in satisfying a course requirement, or representing material prepared by or with another as one's own independent work. In instances where students are permitted to work jointly to complete an assignment, instructors will offer clear guidelines about when and how to collaborate; if a student is unsure, it is the responsibility of the student to ask the instructor.
- 6. **Unfair means**. Use of unfair means generally covers following:
  - a. An attempt to have access to the question paper before the test/examination.
  - b. Use/possession of unauthorized reference material during test/examination.
  - c. Any form of communication by the examinees with any one in or outside the test/examination room while the test/examination is in progress.
  - d. Unauthorised entry into faculty's office or that of his staff with the intention of having an access to or tempering with the official record/exam paper etc.
- 7. Moral Dishonesty. Moral dishonesty means act which does not conform to known norms of decency.

#### **CONDUCT**

- 1. **Extension of the GCUF Code of Conduct**. The GCUF Code of Conduct applies to conduct that occurs on the University premises, at GCUF sponsored activities, and to off-campus conduct that adversely affects the University reputation and/or the pursuit of its objectives. Each member of the GCUF shall be responsible for his/her conduct.
- 2. <u>Classroom Standards</u>. The individual faculty member is primarily responsible for managing the classroom environment. If a student engages in any prohibited or unlawful acts or other behavior that results in disruption of a class, he or she may be directed by the faculty member to leave the class for the remainder of the class period. Students must be protected against infringement of their rights and unfair practices.
- 3. <u>Identification/Registration Card</u>
  - Each member of the University community is issued a picture Identification /Registration card or visitor's pass, and must wear it at all times while on University premises or at University-sponsored activities. Identification/Registration cards must be presented upon entering University buildings and must be worn while on University premises.

- a. Identification/Registration cards are not transferable. The owner of the card will be called upon to account for any fraudulent use of his or her identification card and will be subject to disciplinary action by the University if he or she has aided such fraudulent use. The card will be forfeited if the student to whom it was issued allows any other person to use the same.
- b. Upon card owner's withdrawal from the University, all rights and privileges related to the identification card automatically cease. If the student withdraws, or is suspended or expelled, from the University, the identification card must be surrendered to the College/institute/School.
- 2. <u>Visitors and Guests</u>. Students may be held accountable for the acts of misconduct of their guests while on University premises or at University-sponsored activities. Visitors, including invitees shall conduct themselves, at all times, in a manner which is consistent and in line with maintenance of orderly behaviour in the University premises
- 3. Acts of Ill-Discipline/Prohibited Conduct. All students are prohibited from engaging in conduct resulting in, or leading to, any of the following:
  - a. Academic Dishonesty. Violating the University Policy on Academic Dishonesty by committing, or attempting to commit, academic dishonesty including, but not limited to, cheating, plagiarism, fabrication, facilitating academic dishonesty of others and unauthorized collaboration.
  - b. **Abuse, Assault, Threatening Behavior.** Intentionally or recklessly endangering, threatening, or causing physical or mental harm to any person, or oneself, on University premises or at University-sponsored activities, or intentionally or causing reasonable apprehension of such harm including, but not limited to abusive language and/or physical or verbal intimidation, harassment, coercion.
  - c. <u>Firearms, Explosives and Other Weapons</u>. Illegal or unauthorized use, possession, or storage of firearms, explosives (including, but not limited to fireworks), other weapons, or dangerous chemicals on University premises, whether or not a license to possess the same has been issued to the possessor.
  - d. <u>Violation of Disciplinary Sanction</u>. Knowingly violating terms of any disciplinary sanction imposed in accordance with GCUF Statutes.
  - e. **Furnishing False Information, Forgery or Unauthorized Use of Documents.** Intentionally furnishing false information to the University and its officials; or misusing affiliation with the University to gain access to outside agency/services; or using false information or University resources to compromise the name of the University. Forgery, unauthorized alteration, or unauthorized use of any University document or electronic transmission, or instrument of identification, or academic and non-academic records, signatures, seals, or stamps thereof.
  - f. <u>Disorderly Conduct or Indecent Behavior</u>. Engaging in disorderly or indecent conduct; breaching of peace; or aiding, abetting, or procuring another person to breach the peace on University premises or at University-sponsored functions/activities. Any unauthorized use of electronic or other devices to make an audio or video record of any person while on University premises without his or her prior knowledge.
  - g. Theft. Theft, or attempted theft, of property or services on University premises or at University-sponsored activities.
  - h. <u>Damage to Property or its Destruction.</u> Intentionally or recklessly destroying or damaging, or attempting to destroy or damage, University property or the property of others on University premises or at University-sponsored activities.
  - i. <u>Non-Compliance With Official Direction</u>. Failure to comply with reasonable direction of University officials acting in performance of their duties.
  - j. <u>Violation of University Regulations and Policies</u>. Violating University regulations or policies including amendments and additions adopted since the publication date.
  - k. <u>Alcohol/Drugs/Intoxicants</u>. Distribution, possession, and consumption of alcohol/drugs/intoxicants on University premises or at University-sponsored activities.
  - I. <u>Unauthorized Access to Facilities</u>. Unauthorized access or entry to, or use of, University facilities and equipment. Unauthorized possession, duplication or use of keys to any University premises, facilities or equipment; or, unauthorized entry to or use of University premises.
  - m. <u>Unauthorized, Use of Computer or Electronic Communication Devices</u>. Theft or other abuse of computer facilities and resources including, but not limited to:-
    - (1) Unauthorized entry into a file, to use, read, or change the contents, or for any other purpose.
    - (2) Unauthorized transfer of a file.
    - (3) Use of another individual's identification and/or password.
    - (4) Interference with the work of another student, faculty member or University official.
    - (5) Sending obscene, abusive or threatening messages.
    - (6) Transmission of computer viruses.
    - (7) Interfering with normal operation of the University computing system.
    - (8) Unauthorized duplication of software or other violation of copyright laws.
    - (9) Unauthorized access to, or unauthorized, mischievous or malicious use of University computer equipment or networks, or electronic communication devices, or the use of such equipment or devices to gain unauthorized access to, and/or use of, off-campus computer equipment.
  - n. **Provoking Others to Misconduct**. Intentionally using words or actions to provoke or encourage others to violent or retaliatory behavior, or other acts of misconduct.
  - o. <u>Identification/Registration Cards</u>. Failure to wear, or to produce or surrender the identification card upon the request of a University official.
  - p. **Animals**. Bringing an animal into any University building, with the exception of animals used for authorized laboratory purposes, or animals being used for security purpose for which express permission has been granted.

- a. <u>Demonstrations</u>. Demonstrations exceeding the bounds of free assembly and demonstrations engaging in unlawful acts that cause or imminently threaten injury to person or property, infringes on the rights of other members of the University community leading to or inciting others to disrupt scheduled and/or normal activities within any campus building or area.
- b. **Political Activities**. Unauthorized use of University facilities or equipment for political activities.
- c. **Harassment**. Indulge in following:-
  - (1) Passing remarks, placing visual or written material, aimed at a specific person or group:-
    - . with the intention of causing harm to the person or group; and/or,
    - i creating an environment which limits a student's educational opportunity.
  - (2) Making unwanted verbal or physical advances or explicit derogatory statements toward individuals, which cause them discomfort or humiliation or which interferes with their educational opportunity.
  - (3) Physical assault.
- d. **Gambling**. Unauthorized and/or illegal exchange of money favors or services as a result of an organized or unorganized game or competition.
- e. **Smoking**. Smoking is prohibited on University premises as per the policy already issued.
- f. Abuse of the Student Conduct System. Abusing the student conduct system including, but not limited to:-
  - (1) Failure to obey the notice from a University official to appear for a meeting or hearing as part of the student conduct system.
  - Falsification, distortion or misrepresentation of information before a hearing body or designated hearing officer
    of the University.
  - (3) Disruption or interference with the orderly conduct of a hearing proceeding.
  - (4) Causing a violation of University Code of Conduct hearing to convene in bad faith.
- g. <u>Indecent Behavior at the Campus</u>. Indecent behavior exhibited at the campus including classes, cafeteria, laboratories etc, defying the norms of decency, morality and religious/cultural/social values by single or group of students.
- h. Damage to the university fixtures/furniture, scribbling/carving on desks, wall chalking, misusing of lab/university equipment, etc.
- i. Use of mobile phone in class rooms, examination halls, labs and library thus disrupting the calm of the said rooms.
- 2. **Off-Campus Conduct**. Conduct occurring off University premises be such that it should not affect the interest/image of the University

#### **ENFORCEMENT OF CODE OF CONDUCT**

3. Matters of indiscipline would be referred to the college, school, institution or GCUF authorities, which are authorized to check indiscipline matters and decide as per GCUF rules, regulations and policy. Parents of those students who disobey authority and violate the code of conduct will be informed. Students may be held accountable for the acts of misconduct of their guests while on University premises or at University-sponsored activities. Students who are charged with violations of this Code are subject to disciplinary action as per GCUF rules/regulations/Statutes.

#### PUNISHMENT OR PENALTY FOR ACTS OF ILL-DISCIPLINE

- 4. Punishment or penalty for acts of ill-discipline shall be according to the gravity of the case and may be any one or more of the following:
  - a. Minor Punishments
    - (1) **Warning in writing**. Notice to the offender, orally or in writing, that continuation or repetition of prohibited conduct may be cause for further disciplinary action.
    - (2) **Probation.** Probation for a specific period.
    - (3) **Fine**. Fine which may amount upto Rs.3000.
    - (4) <u>Hostel Suspension/Permanent Removal</u>. Expulsion from the hostel for a specified period, or permanent removal from the residence hall.
    - (5) Withholding of certificate. Withholding of a certificate of good moral character.
    - (6) **Removal of privileges.** Deprivation from the privileges enjoyed by the students.
    - (7) **F Grade**. Award of "F" grade in a paper.
  - b. **Major Punishments** 
    - (1) **Expulsion**. Expulsion from the class for a specific period upto one semester.
    - (2) **Fine**. Fine which may amount upto Rs.10000.
    - (3) **Exam Result.** Cancellation of examination result.
    - (4) **Rustication**. Expulsion or rustication from the University/college/Institue/Centre for a specific period.
    - (5) **Degree**. Non conferment of degree/transcript.
    - (6) Relegation/withdrawal.
- 5. Other sanctions or a combination of above mentioned punishments as deemed appropriate.

#### **DISCIPLINE IN THE HOSTELS**

1. Instructions already issued in this regard by the Administrative Directorate will be followed.

#### **DISCIPLINE PROCESS**

- 2. <u>Case referrals</u>. Each case of ill-discipline shall be reported to the DG of the College/Institute/Centre/ through HOD or the warden of the hostel. Any charge should be submitted as soon as possible after the alleged violation takes place, preferably within 24 hours of the violation. Those referring cases are normally expected to serve as complainant and to present relevant evidence in disciplinary hearings before the GCUF/College/Institute/Centre Discipline Committee. DG upon the gravity of the case, will decide to award of minor punishment at College/School level or refer the same to GCUF Discipline Committee for decision by senior competent authority for major punishment.
- 3. **Procedure-disciplinary hearing.** A disciplinary hearing is a formal process conducted by the GCUF/College/Institute/Centre Discipline Committee. This formal process is designed to gather and consider relevant information regarding the alleged violation/s of the Code and to determine and recommend a punishment. Every effort will be made to expedite proceedings pursuant to allegations within a reasonable period.
- 4. **Punishments**. GCUF/College/Institute/Centre Discipline Committee will recommend the punishment according to the gravity of the case after giving full opportunity to the defaulter to give his point of view before recommending the punishment for award by the DG/Rector.
- 5. **Appeals**. An appeal against the Discipline Committee's decision can be filed with the DG/Rector within fifteen days of the announcement of the decision.

#### **GENERAL**

- 6. **Federal/Provincial Laws and Ordinances**. Violation of a Federal/Provincial law or ordinance will be dealt accordingly under these laws.
- 7. **Gender Mixing**. Students are strictly reminded to follow the accepted social and cultural norms of the society. Undue intimacy and unacceptable proximity, openly or in isolated areas will not be tolerated.
- 8. <u>Littering</u>. It is the responsibility of all to keep the Campus environment clean and tidy. Therefore, no littering or trash should be carelessly thrown or left on the Campus premises. The designated waste boxes should be used for the purpose.
- 9. Sports
  - a. Sports expects all individuals and teams involved in sport to participate showing sportsmanship, respect, consideration and appreciation towards their opponents, team-mates, officials and University staff at all times.
  - b. Under no circumstances should you react in a violent manner nor use any form of foul or abusive language, whether it is directed at a member of staff, match official, opponent, playing colleague, team official or spectator.
  - c. Individuals signing the player registration form are agreeing to abide by this code of conduct and will accept that any deviation from these rules will result in disciplinary action being taken by the University.
  - d. Persons under the influence of drugs are not permitted to participate in sport activities at the University and as such will result in disciplinary action by GCUF.
  - e. On a final note, please remember that no referee, umpire or official is perfect, you won't agree with every decision that is made and, just like players, they make mistakes too.
- 10. <u>Dress Code</u>. In order to maintain academic dignity and sanctity of the institution, students and staff of the university are required to wear decent dress keeping in view the local cultural values. The dress restriction is not to impose any rigidity or regimentation but is in accordance with the spirit of discipline and punctuality which is the cardinal aspect of life style at GCUF campuses. Purpose of Dress Code is to establish the basic guide lines for appropriate work dress that promotes a positive image of GCUF and also allow maximum flexibility to maintain good morale, respect, cultural values and due consideration for safety while working at laboratories. To abide by the student dress code, student should not:
  - a. Wear tight or see-through dress.
  - b. Wear Shorts, or sleeve-less shirts.
  - c. Wear Tee-Shirts/dress bearing language or Art, which appears to be provocative or indecent and is likely to offend others.
  - d. Wear torn clothing.
  - e. Wear jogging or exercise clothing during classes.
  - f. Put on excessive makeup or wear expensive jewellery.
  - g. Wear untidy, gaudy or immodest dress in classrooms, cafeteria and university offices.
  - h. Wear unprofessional attire in formal programs and interviews.

All faculty members, administrative staff, support staff and students will be expected to monitor this code of conduct and report any such disregard or violations to college/school/institution/ headquarter GCUF for taking appropriate action/remedial measures.
